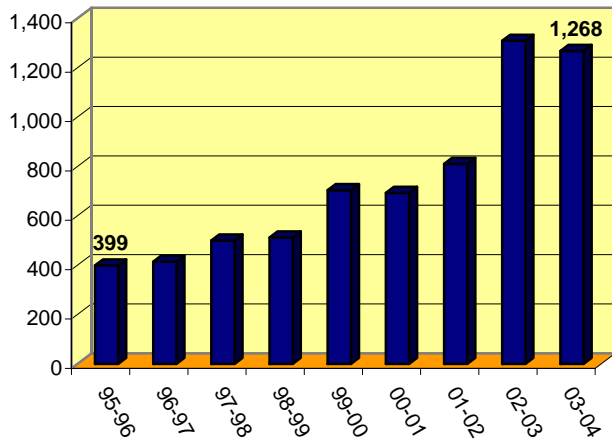


# Dual Credit Student Enrollment

## (Follow-up on the Retention of Dual Credit Students)

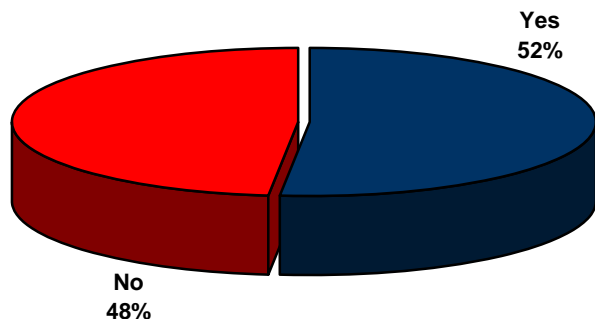
Enrollment in dual credit classes at Del Mar College has grown dramatically over the last several years, increasing over threefold from academic years 1995-96 to 2003-04.

Dual Credit Enrollment by Academic Year



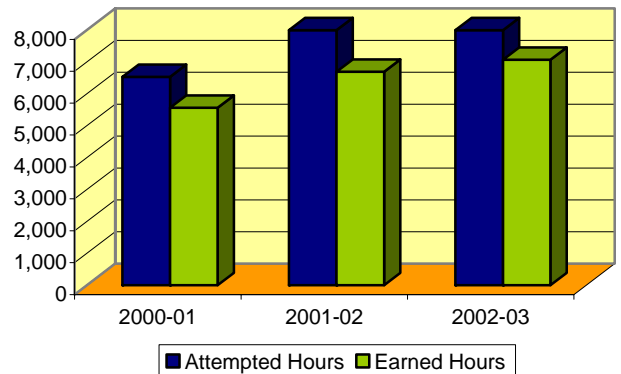
Most students who enroll in dual credit classes continue to reenroll in Del Mar College courses after they graduate from high school. Of the dual credit students who entered Del Mar College between fall 2000 and summer 1 2003, over one-half had reenrolled in college-level courses at Del Mar College after their high school graduation, as of spring 2005.

Dual Credit Students Entering 2000-2003 Who Reenrolled at DMC After High School Graduation, As of Spring 2005

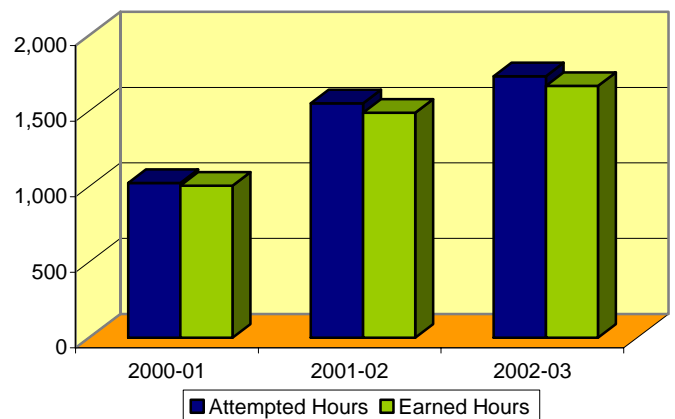


Dual credit students who reenrolled in college-level courses accumulated significant credit hour totals. The dual credit students who entered between fall 2000 and fall 2003 and also reenrolled after their high school graduation averaged about 28 cumulative attempted semester credit hours through spring 2005. Of those who did not reenroll, the average cumulative semester credit hours attempted was about seven.

Dual credit students have a higher rate of course completion than students overall. The overall course completion rate for college-level courses is about 70 percent. Of the dual credit students who entered Del Mar College between fall 2000 and summer 2003, the average course completion rate was over 80 percent.
