1. Apply to Del Mar College

2. Complete TSI Assessment or Submit Exemptions

3. Submit Proof of Bacterial Meningitis Vaccination

For students 21 years of age or younger and administered within five years.

4. Submit Official Transcripts

5. Submit Additional Documents

If necessary, per your specific admission status. Check with the Student Enrollment Center at (361) 698-1290.
