Del Mar College, founded in 1935 under the control of the Board of Trustees of the Corpus Christi Independent School District, to provide two years of postsecondary education, became an independent political subdivision, the Corpus Christi Junior College District in 1951. In 1999, the College officially changed its name to Del Mar College District. The College is governed by nine elected Regents, four elected At-Large and five who represent individual Districts 1 through 5. The attachment indicates the various names of the Regents and terms of service and an organizational chart of the College.

The College has attempted to operate with a reasonable Ad Valorem tax rate even with local taxpayers assuming an ever-increasing portion of the College's budgetary requirements. The 2010 midyear 5% reduction in State Appropriations and the additional 10% reduction for the 2011-2013 biennium came at the same time as a 6.7% loss (\$1B) in appraised value in the College District. Although the Board of Regents raised student charges by 13.5%, the record enrollment growth experienced by the College combined with the loss of State Appropriations and Ad Valorem taxes has forced the College to severely reduce its operating budget, defer more physical plant maintenance, slash instructional equipment and supply requests, curtail professional development, and eliminate course sections.

Del Mar College has been the most affordable higher education opportunity for most residents of the Coastal Bend for 75 years, but as the State continues to shift access to higher education from a State benefit to an individual responsibility, many students and working adults are seeing this golden opportunity as an impossible goal. The College's population closely mirrors the regional demographics, with 58.6% females, 67.2% minority (59.3% Hispanic), 70% of minority students on financial assistance, and 80% of entering students requiring developmental education.

The Del Mar College Service Area covers four and one-half counties, but the taxing district includes only five independent school districts within Nueces County. Since the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's contact-hour formula has not been fully funded for years, the total dollars contributed by local property owners is almost double the state reimbursement dollars. Currently, student charges account for 28% of the operational budget, with funds from property taxes representing 47%. State appropriations only represent 25%. Taxpayers not only are responsible for providing the physical facilities of the College, as evidenced by the \$108M Capital Bond overwhelmingly approved by the voters in 2003, they are being forced to carry the majority burden for instructional costs.

The College operates two campuses and a newly established outreach center, funded through a corporate donation and economic development funding, to serve the 320,000 residents of the District. The College offers options in academic, business, occupational, professional, and personal development for students focused on achieving their dreams. The College serves about 25,000 students annually with 288 tenure-track faculty with an average age of 51.6 years.

Even as demands on the College's budget continue to increase while state appropriations decrease, the College stays committed to providing South Texas students affordable opportunities to improve the standard of living for themselves and the area community. Del Mar College District endorses the funding request of the Texas Association of Community Colleges for biennium funding (\$2.213B), including the base funding (\$1.844B) and funding to support the tremendous growth experienced by the State's community colleges (\$368.8M).

The College also supports the efforts of TACC, working in collaboration with the Legislature, to finalize the issue of proportionality as it impacts community colleges. Community college students and local tax payers should not have to shoulder the burden of proportionality because the state does not cover the full cost of instruction as promised to local taxing entities when community colleges were established. We urge the LBB and Legislature to work together to solidify the covenant reached last session between the Legislature and the Governor's Office on this issue and enable community colleges to focus on their primary mission of providing increased access to quality higher education.


