

# Four Colleges Plan Telecasts on Ch. 6

Del Mar, along with other South Texas colleges, will participate in a joint effort in producing educational programming for the South Texas area.

Del Mar, Corpus Christi State University, Texas A&I University and Bee County College have begun producing television programming to fill the time slot formerly held by the "State of the Region" program which had appeared on Channel 6.

The main idea behind the programming is to display the educational benefits one could receive by attending a local college.

According to Claudia Jackson, of the Public Information Office, each school is expected to produce one program a month, with programming appearing Saturday at 12 noon. Channel 6 has donated the time as part of its public service programming.

The programming is a cooperative effort between schools, and the basic purpose is to enrich the area with educational benefits. Del Mar's first program, according to Ms. Jackson, will most likely feature the Restaurant Management Program. This will give local restaurant owners an excellent chance to see what is taught, and what kind of students graduate from the program, she said.

The programming will also give people in the community a chance to see what types of classes are taught at Del Mar, and the programs aimed at providing better educational opportunity for students.

The programming will also serve as a previewer of coming cultural events.

Del Mar has long been a focal point for cultural events in Corpus Christi, providing its students with the best in entertainment, educational and political speakers, writers and historians. The programming will serve the community by giving them a chance to participate in local cultural events.

All practical ideas will be given serious consideration, but final decisions on programming will be with the administration.
