# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

We understand being new to a campus can be overwhelming! Our advisors have put together some of the questions they are asked most to help you in transitioning to Del Mar.

Most of these answers can be found within this Advising Guide:

#### **ADVISING & REGISTRATION**

Why do I have to see an advisor if I have less than 30 credits?

Your advisor wants to make sure that you are on the right track. By requiring advising sessions before registration, we can answer your questions and ensure you are taking the right classes.

## What is the credit hour number for full-time and part-time in Summer sessions?

To be considered full-time in the Summer (courses available from the end of May through August), you must be enrolled in 12 hours overall.

Usually, it is recommended to complete no more than 6 hours in Summer I and 6 hours in Summer II.

#### **QUESTIONS ABOUT MY MAJOR**

#### What kind of degrees/certificates does Del Mar have, and what can I do with either?

This is a great question! Visit **delmar.edu/degrees** to see all of our majors – we offer over 150! When you find the major you're interested in, click on it to learn more about career information.

#### Do I have to take core classes?

This will depend on your major! Not all majors require core (basic) courses such as History or Science. It is best to meet with your advisor to be sure. Schedule a meeting with your advisor at *delmar.edu/advisors*.

#### **TUITION & FINANCIAL AID**

## If I am getting a financial aid refund, where will my money go?

Financial aid refunds, which are funds left over from your financial aid after your tuition & fees are paid, will be disbursed according to the disbursement calendar. You must select a disbursement method through Viking Pay.

You can find more information on that at *delmar. edu/afford*, then click "Disbursements," and "Find current schedules."

### **GET CONNECTED**

- a. Activate Your DMC Email and Student Portal WebDMC
  - Your Del Mar College student email provides up-to-date information about on-campus events. Many of our student services offices (financial aid, admissions, etc.) and your instructors will contact you via email.
  - WebDMC is Del Mar College's secure student portal where you can check your admissions and financial aid status, register for classes, pay your tuition, view your unofficial transcripts, grades, class schedules, and more! Log in at *delmar.edu/webdmc* to discover your DMC.
- b. Download the VikingGo App
  - VikingGo allows you to register for classes, view interactive campus maps, see our calendar of events, and more! Download this free app to have DMC information at your fingertips. Available on the App Store or Google Play.
- c. Download Your Free Microsoft Software!
  - DMC students are able to download Microsoft Office Suite (which includes Word, Excel, and PowerPoint) for free at *https:// portal.office.com.* Sign in with your DMC email and password.

### **NEXT STEPS**

Submitting Official Transcript(s)

• A final, official transcript (high school and college, if applicable) must be received by the Student Enrollment Center to complete your enrollment status and is required to determine your financial aid eligibility. #### b. Meet with your advisor

#### c. Apply for Financial Aid

• Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at **fafsa.gov** and the Del Mar College Foundation Scholarship Application at **delmar.edu/scholarships**.

#### **YOUR SCHEDULE**

#### a. Read Your Schedule

- Log in to WebDMC at any time to view your schedule. Under 'Academic Profile,' click on 'My Class Schedule' and select the term you wish to view.
- b. Change Your Schedule: Change, Drop, Cancel and Withdraw
  - Schedule Changes Students can make schedule changes any time during registration. Be sure to keep a copy of your tuition receipt.
  - Dropping a Class Check the Academic Calendar at *delmar.edu/calendar* for deadlines to drop classes.
  - Canceled Classes Students with canceled classes need to come to the Registrar's Office (*delmar.edu/registrar*) on the Heritage or Windward Campus for assistance.
  - Withdrawing from Courses for more information on withdrawing from courses, please see page 11.

#### ACCEPT FINANCIAL AID AWARDS

After you have completed your FAFSA, log in to WebDMC to check your financial aid status or pending documents under *Students>Financial Aid>Financial Aid Checklist*.

Once all items are received and processed, accept your financial aid award under *Students>Financial Aid>Accept or Reject My Financial Aid Awards* and then choose the correct financial aid year.

### **PAY TUITION AND FEES**

You may pay your tuition bill in person or online. You will be dropped from your classes if you do not make payment arrangements before your bill due date!

You may pay your bill with credit/debit card, check, or with cash in person. Visit our payment site for details. Financial aid counts as a payment. You can verify your financial aid award via WebDMC or contact our Financial Aid Services office. Del Mar College offers a convenient payment plan for fall and spring semesters. The installment option provides for one-half (1/2) payment of the tuition and fees in advance of the beginning semester; one quarter payment (1/4) prior to the start of the sixth class week and final one quarter (1/4) prior to the beginning of the eleventh class week.

If you have financial assistance remaining after your tuition is paid, you will receive the remainder in a disbursement. Refunds for financial aid disbursements will be sent to you according to the schedule on our website – delmar.edu/afford, then click on disbursements.

#### **STUDENT ID, PARKING PERMIT & BOOKS**

#### Student ID

- Student identification cards (IDs) are issued free of charge when you first register; however, a charge will be made for replacements. Also, IDs must be validated each subsequent registration period (semester).
- Cards are good for admission to College functions, for obtaining library materials, and for using recreational facilities. You should carry it with you at all times and present it upon request.
- You can get your card at the Barth Learning Resource Center (Windward Campus). Student IDs are temporarily available on the Heritage Campus in the Harvin Center, outside of the Student Enrollment Center (Rm. 127).

#### **Parking Permit**

- To park your car on campus, you need a parking permit. To get a parking permit, fill out a parking registration card and submit it to Campus Security. Campus security is located at the Maintenance Building on Heritage Campus (corner of Kosar and Naples), and on Windward Campus in the Coleman Student Center.
- Parking permits should be displayed in the front windshield of the vehicle. Due to construction please check the Del Mar College webpage for updates to locations for parking permits.

# PLANNING YOUR Schedule

#### **ADVISOR OR COUNSELOR?**

Each Del Mar College campus provides students the opportunity to meet with both academic advisors and licensed professional counselors. If you are unsure over whether to meet with an advisor or counselor regarding your academic, personal, career, or disability issues, you may want to visit the Student Enrollment Center for directions to the appropriate office.

#### HOW MANY HOURS SHOULD I TAKE?

According to the Texas Administrative Code, it is suggested that you do not take more credit hours than the number of weeks you are in school for that semester.

For example, in the 16-week fall and spring semesters, you should not enroll in more than 16 semester hours. In a six-week summer session, you should not enroll in more than six semester hours.

#### **CREDIT HOUR GUIDELINES**

6 or less hours 6-8 hours 9-11 hours 12 hours or more Part-Time Half-Time Three-Quarter Time Full-Time

#### **THREE-PEAT RULE**

If you repeat a course for three or more times, a higher tuition rate is charged for most credit courses, starting on your third attempt.

#### SIX-DROP RULE

If you are a first-time student who entered college in Fall 2007 or after, you cannot drop more than six courses, including any course you have dropped at another college/university in Texas, according to Senate Bill 1231. There are exceptions to this policy if you show good cause for dropping a course(s). For further information, please contact the Registrar's Office.

#### Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) Information: Student Records

Your records pertaining to directory information and education are kept by the Registrar's Office. According to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), education records are those records that relate directly to your academic progress maintained by the institution.

If you want to review your records, you may do so by requesting and presenting your ID card in the Registrar's Office. If, upon review, you desire to challenge any portion of your records, you should contact the Vice President of Student Affairs.

School officials, who act in your educational interest within the limitations of their need to know, have access to your records without your prior written consent. The FERPA request form can be found at **delmar.edu/registrar.** 

# WITHDRAWING FROM A COURSE

Withdrawal from a course occurs after the official day of record and will result in a "W" on your transcript, and no credit will be awarded for the courses. The last day to drop a class can be found on the Academic Calendar for each semester. After that date, the grade earned will be posted to your transcript and calculated into the GPA.

If you decide to withdraw from a specific course(s), you should complete a Drop/Withdrawal Form from the Registrar's Office. The drop process will be initiated once the completed form has been received by the Registrar's Office. The form must be turned in prior to the published deadline for withdrawals found on the Academic Calendar.

You are strongly encouraged to visit with a Retention Case Manager by calling (361) 698-1948 to discuss potential consequences of this decision. It is also recommended that you meet with your advisor to discuss how this affects your academic plan to completion.

Since 2007, Texas law limits the number of times a student may withdraw ("W") from a course at a public institution of higher education in Texas. **Students are limited to a total of six "W's" during their entire undergraduate career.** All students who started college during or after fall 2007 are affected by the six-drop limit, including students who transfer to Del Mar College from another Texas public institution. If you were enrolled as a student prior to fall 2007, the six-drop limit does not affect you.

- Submit the form in person at the Registrar's Office on the Heritage Campus in the Harvin Student Center, 2nd Floor, or on the Windward Campus in the Coleman Center.
- Complete the form and scan electronically by email to *reginfo@delmar.edu*.
- Complete the form and fax directly to the Registrar's Office at (361) 698-1857.

# **STUDENT RESOURCES**

Del Mar College offers a wide variety of special services and programs geared to help students reach their education goals. Students should take advantage of these opportunities to make the most of the community college experience.

**COUNSELING CENTER** – Licensed Professional Counselors are available to help students cope with social, behavioral, and personal issues impacting academic success and/or overall mental health.

**CHILD CARE** – The Morris L. Lichtenstein, Jr. Center for Early Learning (CEL) serves as a lab school for the Child Development/Early Childhood Program.

The CEL is nationally accredited through the National Association for the Education of Young Children and provides high quality full-time care for children ages 18 months to 5 years old.

#### **FINANCIAL AID**

Del Mar College distributed more than \$31 million in financial aid to more than 10,800 eligible students last year. Financial Aid professionals will help you access the assistance you're qualified to receive to build the future you want. You may apply for aid at any time, but we encourage you to apply before these priority deadlines:

#### **Financial Aid Priority Deadlines**

- FAFSA Available October 1
- Priority Deadline for 2022-2023 academic year is January 15

#### **APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID**

Here are the steps to take if you want financial assistance:

- Submit a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). It takes about one week for Del Mar College to receive your FAFSA.
- Check the Financial Aid section of WebDMC for application status, additional required documents.
- Submit any additional required documents.
