Purpose

The Early Admissions Program is designed to offer selected students an opportunity for greater academic challenge and a fuller learning day. Del Mar College provides eligible high school students the opportunity to earn college credits while concurrently working toward a high school diploma.

The Early Admissions Program is designed for high school students who have demonstrated the ability to accept academic challenges and responsibility. Generally, Early Admissions credits are applicable toward career certifications and associate's degrees, and often credit transfers into bachelor's degree requirements.

Credits earned through the Early Admissions
Program only count as college credit and cannot be used to fulfill high school graduation requirements.

Program

The Early Admissions Program will not compete with, nor take the place of, your high school courses. College level courses normally available at the high school level should be taken through the Del Mar College Dual Credit program. College level courses not available at your high school may be taken under this program.

To be eligible for the Early Admissions Program, you must meet the following requirements:

- earliest enrollment can occur when a high school transcript can verify you have completed your 9th grade year of high school,
- have signed approval from parent or guardian and high school counselor,
- take only those classes for which assessment levels are met,
- adhere to all policies of Del Mar College.

Procedures

- Complete a Del Mar College admissions application on-line at <u>www.ApplyTexas.org</u>. Select "High School Early Admission (college credit only)" under the "Educational Information" section.
- 2. Submit an official high school transcript.
- 3. Provide Texas Success Initiative Assessment placement scores, unless you meet one of the following exemptions:

- 4. Provide proof upon receipt of the Bacterial Meningitis Vaccination.
- 5. Complete the Request for Early Admissions (printed on the back of this brochure).

Eligibility will be determined by the Director of Admissions. Applicant may not register for any classes until approved by the Director. Course approval is required every enrollment period.

Additional Information

- Regular tuition and fees will apply.
- No financial aid is available for Del Mar College Early Admissions Program courses.
- Textbooks must be purchased by the student.
- Day, evening, and online classes are available.
- For first-time Early Admission students, you are eligible to take courses beginning Summer Session 2 (July) after the completion of 9th grade.
- Students have access to the College's facilities and services (libraries, computer labs, etc.).
- No numeric grade will be collected and sent to the high school for Early Admissions courses.
- Del Mar College transcript will not be released until verification of graduation from high school is received by the Registrar.
- Your enrollment will be verified in the approved courses.
- Students should be aware of UIL regulations.
