  - DMC students compete with students from NATS two- and four-year institutional members.

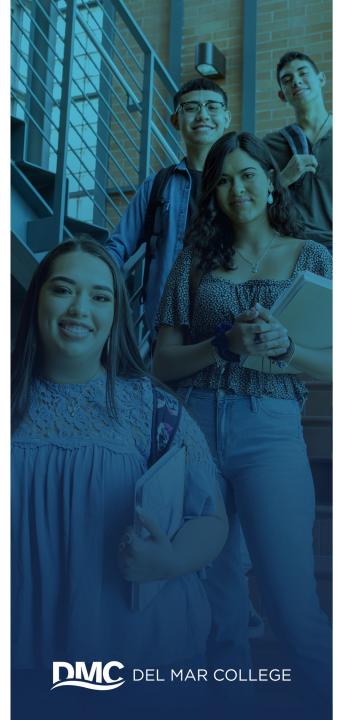
The DMC Music program is accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM).

The Texas Commission on Community College Finance (SB 1230) adopted by the 87th Texas State Legislature, convened on November 15th, 2021. The goal of the Commission is to make recommendations for consideration by the 88th Texas Legislature regarding the state funding formula and funding levels for public junior colleges in Texas that would be sufficient to sustain viable junior college education and training offerings throughout the state and improve student outcomes in alignment with state postsecondary goals.

There are three workgroup assignments within this Commission:

#### **College Operations**

#### Student Support

Other priorities include: workforce demand and skill gaps; dual credit programs and costs; variation between taxing districts and service areas; student graduation, transfer, and success metrics, and the relationship between economic cycles and student enrollment.

The Racial Profiling Report, certifying the College has an exempt status, was filed by Interim Police Chief, Lauren White on January 11, 2022.

#### MINUTES OF THE WORKSHOP MEETING OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE DEL MAR COLLEGE DISTRICT

December 14, 2021

#### CALL TO ORDER/QUORUM CALL

Ms. Scott called the meeting to order with a quorum present. She requested a moment of silence followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and Del Mar College Vision Statement.

**GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENTS** – The public was given the opportunity to provide public comments (both general and specific to any agenda item).

There were no public comments made for this meeting.

#### **AGENDA**

#### **ITEMS OF BUSINESS:**

Mr. Augustin Rivera, Jr. began the redistricting by explaining that he has been communicating with outside counsel, Mr. David Mendez from the law firm Bickerstaff, Heath, Delgado, Acosta, regarding the 2021 Redistricting Initial Assessment for the College. Mr. Rivera stated Mr. Mendez was present to discuss possible action on any single-member district imbalance the Board of Regents may need to address before the next Board election in November 2022. Mr. Rivera then introduced Mr. Mendez who began his presentation and advised he would review the process of the census data and the obligations required by the College as a college district as well as applicable redistricting laws.

Mr. Mendez stated because the College was divided into single member districts, the College is under the "one person, one vote" principle which means it has to have the same number of persons in each district, within a 10% deviation. Mr. Mendez stated the overall district grew in population (about 5% from the last decade) but there is a substantial imbalance among the districts. Mr. Mendez reviewed an example deviation calculation with the Board. Mr. Mendez reviewed Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act and stated when you look at the College's District and it has a concentration of a minority group that's protected, then you have to make sure you don't divide that community in a way that's going to limit or dilute their ability to elect and also do not want to concentrate all the minority voters in one or two districts to not be able to elect a proportionate share. Mr. Mendez reviewed the *Bush v. Vera* Harris County gerrymandering case and stated the Courts have articulated a set of principles which do not allow an imbalanced map.

Mr. Mendez provided a review of the 2013 Shelby County vs. Holder Supreme Court case and the Voting Rights Act history with the Board. Mr. Mendez stated the Board has to make sure to follow the basic principles of anti-discrimination or it could get sued under Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act. The criteria to use to adopt is as follows: 1.) Identifiable boundaries; 2.) Maintaining communities of interest & neighborhoods; 3.) Using whole voting precincts, if possible; 4.) Basing plan on existing districts; 5.) Adopting districts of relatively equal size; 6.) Drawing districts that are compact and contiguous; 7.) Keeping existing incumbents in their districts; and 8.) Narrowly tailoring plan to comply with the Voting Rights Act.

Mr. Mendez stated the steps to balance conflicting legal obligations in redistricting are to analyze the final plan in terms of how well it conforms to the adopted criteria, make sure

the analysis is considered by the Governing Body before Plan adoption, and avoid districts that are not compact.

Mr. Mendez provided the Board with the elements that will be included in the Plan which include the following: 1.) Initial Assessment; 2.) Adopt plan criteria, guidelines; 3.) Develop illustrative plan(s); 4.) Public comment/hearing; 5.) Analyze comments; 6.) Adopt a final plan; 7.) Implementation; and 8.) Reconfigure election precincts. Mr. Mendez stated they will send each Board member a questionnaire regarding any imbalances so as not to violate the Open Meetings Act. Mr. Mendez and team will gather the information and will discuss in public session to avoid any perception of impropriety. A proposed Redistricting timeline was discussed. Mr. Mendez stated they will draft and draw the districts to maintain the principles in the Voting Rights Act so if there is a challenge, the redrawn districts will show compliance.

Chair Scott stated that the Board had discussed a potential May adoption and asked that staff work on the dates for drawing sessions in public hearings based on the regular board meetings schedule, preferably in workshop sessions.

Mr. Mendez continued and provided the Board with information from the Demographics Report - Summary 2020 Census Total Population. Mr. Mendez stated Districts 4 and 5 grew which means Districts 1, 2 and 3 are each 11% to 15% underpopulated. The ideal population size is 64,379 persons in each district. Mr. Mendez reviewed the growth dynamic of the population including voting age level, demographics, and territory. Mr. Mendez stated his team will be able to provide registered voter and Spanish surname registered voter data and can also show how many registered voters are a minority in a district. Mr. Mendez stated he was available to answer any of the Board's questions at any time.

Mr. Mendez provided a summary of the Resolution before the Board which includes the rules for public participation whether it's comments that need to be done in writing, requiring the same census numbers to be used in a comparison plan, deadlines for comparison plans, and number of public hearings.

Chair Scott stated the Board's workshops could be set up as an opportunity for public comment.

Mr. Rivera reviewed the proposed Resolution with the Board which included criteria Mr. Mendez and his firm developed in accordance with legal principles.

Chair Scott asked for a clarification regarding Item No. 3 regarding where it is not practical for a district to be drawn considering county election precincts means voting precincts.

Mr. Rivera stated these guidelines are to set up an orderly process where the public has the information to participate.

Regent Kelly made a motion to adopt the Resolution as

presented regarding criteria for use in the 2021 redistricting process. Regent Garza seconded the motion. There was no further discussion from the Board. There were no public comments. A vote was taken by show of hands and the motion carried unanimously, 7-0, amongst Regents present, with Regents Scott, Adame, Averyt, Bennett, Garza, Hutchinson, and Kelly in favor.

Regent Averyt made a motion to adopt the Resolution as presented for guidelines for persons submitting specific redistricting proposal and providing comments submitted in draft form. Regent Hutchinson seconded the motion. There was no further discussion from the Board. There were no public comments. A vote was taken by show of hands and the motion carried unanimously, 7-0, amongst Regents present, with Regents Scott, Adame, Averyt, Bennett, Garza, Hutchinson, and Kelly in favor.

Dr. Escamilla provided introductory comments and Dr. Kristina Wilson began her presentation by reviewing the College's Strategic Plan: Aspire. Engage. Achieve. The College developed an operational plan which includes KPI thresholds, targets and institutional strategies put into place to support the attainment of the plans, goals, and objectives. The focus during this workshop will be Goal 2. Recruitment and Persistence.

Dr. Wilson presented the Board with information regarding the Strategic Enrollment Management Plan (SEM) which was aligned with the Strategic Plan. SEM focuses on strategies which the College will implement to impact these aspects of student in light of the global pandemic and its impact on students. SEM was presented in partnership with Student Services, Enrollment Management, Planning and Institutional Effectiveness, and Instruction.

The SEM is based on guided pathways framework and focuses on the first three stages of the pathway's framework: connection, entry, and progress. Each of the three pathway stages include key performance indicators, both the original indicators included in the strategic plan and new indicators. After reviewing Goal 2 KPIs and large college peer group comparisons, Dr. Wilson introduced Ms. Patricia Benavides-Dominguez to speak about the Connect stage, from initial interest to enrollment.

Ms. Benavides-Dominguez stated it was important to remember the Strategic Plan and the SEM are living documents. SEM Plan Goal One's objective is to increase access through new and improved partnerships and programs. The student headcount for Fall 2021 was 10,395, the threshold is 11,000 and the target is 12,500. The student headcount for KPI for

Fall 2022 threshold is 10,500 with our target at 11,000 and for Fall 2024, 11,000 threshold with the target at 11,500.

Ms. Benavides-Dominguez provided detailed information and statistics to the Board regarding Student On-Ramps/Pipelines, Classification, Student Intent, and 2021 High School Matriculation. Ms. Benavides-Dominguez also reviewed the process the College has with the ISD partners to better track students graduating and assisting them to attend Del Mar College.

Dr. Escamilla commented on the data regarding 35% of all Nueces County high school students doing nothing for five years and are not tracked into any form of employment, education, or service. Ms. Benavides-Dominguez continued with her presentation and provided information regarding students after graduating from area ISD schools and their attendance percentage at colleges and universities.

Ms. Benavides-Dominguez proceeded with information regarding First Time in College (FTIC) student numbers and stated the numbers are trending down. However, the goal is to increase the FTICs despite the impact of the pandemic. The student headcount and student contact hours were reviewed along with a historical perspective. There has been a steady increase in contact hours for the last five years, credit hours are trending up for Fall 2021, and Continuing Education hours are trending up.

Ms. Benavides-Dominguez introduced Associate Vice President for Student Affairs, Cheryl Sanders. Ms. Sanders began her presentation discussing KPI 3 regarding students that receive Pell Grants and five-year trends. This indicator is important to track students that apply for federal financial aid and maximize their funding eligibility. In 2020, the target of 4,500 students received Pell Grants and the plan is to increase the target by 3% by year 2024. Ms. Sanders stated the Financial Aid Office has an Outreach Specialist that travels to all area high schools to help increase the number of students attending Del Mar College.

Ms. Sanders introduced Ms. Lorette Williams, Director of Communication and Marketing. Ms. Williams began her portion of the presentation reviewing the marketing campaign platforms used to reach students which include television, radio, outdoor billboards, internet, social media, and print. Ms. Williams also discussed new marketing innovations, including a unique web address that was created to help track the marketing activity. The Fall 2021 campaign marketing data and landing page views showed there were over 45,000 views directly from the delmar.edu/achieve URL. This webpage included information for enrollment, registration dates, tuition payment deadlines, and links to register and contact an advisor. Also, the Fall 2021 marketing data trends did show an increase in visitors to the College's website by just over 5%. The average household sees a Del Mar television ad four times per week during a registration cycle; 95% of all DMC streaming audio commercials were listened through completion, as commercials were not skippable; and 2,845,264 impressions were delivered via broadcast, podcast and streaming alone. The next round of postcards that are mailed out will include a unique QR code that will track if a user visits the College website via that postcard.

Dr. Escamilla also commented about utilizing geo-fencing and specifically targeted ads.

Ms. Sanders continued with the presentation regarding strategies and activities for the SEM Plan Goal One in connection with recruitment which includes improving reputation/image in the service area through unified branding and messaging, and measuring internal and external community surveys; increasing targeted outreach efforts featuring strategically recruited employees, alumni, and students and measure the number of non-recruitment participants; increasing DMC employees as recruitment ambassadors and measuring the number of DMC employees trained as recruitment ambassadors; identifying matriculation levels of the Educational Opportunity Center Grant participants and measuring the number of EOCG participants matriculating to DMC; and increasing community awareness of financial aid opportunities for post-secondary education and measuring the number of participants per engagement.

Dr. Escamilla responded to Regent Garza's question regarding the idea of Regents volunteering to speak to students. Chair Scott stated the need for alumni ambassadors, student ambassadors, or regent ambassadors should be included in recruitment efforts as this is a high priority for the Board of Regents. Regent Averyt reiterated the offer for the Board of Regents to assist.

Dr. Wilson continued with the presentation "Enter" from initial enrollment to completion of first college-level course, also called onboarding. Key performance indicators were reviewed which include targets, thresholds, and TSI requirements for KPI 1- Students earning 6+ credits in Term 1; KPI 2- Academically unprepared students who satisfy TSI within 2 years; and KPI 3- Academically unprepared students completing a college-level course in the subject they entered not ready within 2 years.

Dr. Wilson responded to Chair Scott and Regent Kelly's questions regarding thresholds, state averages, and future numbers for non-remedial students. Dr. Escamilla commented that the breaking down of a 16-week semester into two courses should have a dramatic impact on the six plus credits in first term students.

Dr. Escamilla responded to Regent Bennett's comment regarding an alternate Math approach and pilot program, as well as addressing course corrections or adjustments.

Dr. Wilson introduced Dr. Jonda Halcomb, Vice President and Chief Academic Officer, who provided information regarding working with under-prepared student to help increase their academic related skills, their motivation for learning and their social engagement through. Instruction, advising and support services.

Dr. Halcomb stated the Student Enrollment Center and Testing launched a new TSI initiative in which an advisor is on-site when the student takes the test. The student can meet with that advisor immediately to discuss placement preparation and retesting options and the initiative has gotten a good response. Dr. Halcomb stated that a new STEM division is one of their top goals as well as creating stronger corequisite courses in

mathematics, so students will have more interest and be more engaged. Another option is a Non-Course Based Option or NCBO which assists students through the areas in which they have the most difficulty and will help the students succeed. We will keep positive attitudes among the math students to help them believe they can do math.

Also, the objectives of SEM Plan Goal 2 to simplify onboarding processes were discussed which include reducing systemic barriers within onboarding process and implementing a student hub for registration activities; reducing barriers that impact student progression; reducing time to student entry to college-reducing coursework and providing clarity/personnel to support development education course placements (example: TSI advising after testing), new corequisite numbering system for math courses and new corequisite course (Math for Business and Social Sciences), new non-course based option (NCBO) for students who miss college-readiness cut off score in Math; increasing the frequency of on-boarding training for employees and providing customer service training to improve student experience; increasing utilization of financial aid resources and scholarships with the financial aid advisor traveling to area high schools to provide onsite FAFSA assistance and financial aid workshops for students and parents.

Dr. Wilson continued with the presentation regarding the pathway in the SEM called Progress and the enrollment into a program of study through completion of 75% of requirements. The KPIs for Goal 3 include persistence rates, students earning 15% credits in year 1, and classifying students as sophomores. The objective for SEM Plan Goal 3 is to improve retention and provide support. Dr. Wilson reviewed the persistence rates of the College and the comparisons to the Texas large college cohorts. The College's one and two-year persistence rates for FTIC students dipped in 2020 due to the impact of the pandemic.

Dr. Wilson and Dr. Escamilla responded to Chair Scott's question regarding the College's high part-time student numbers compared to other large college cohorts.

Dr. Wilson continued reviewing the KPIs which included a new KPI 2 - students earning 15+ credits in one year, students earning 30+ credits in year one, and classifying students as sophomores.

Ms. Sanders provided SEM Plan Goal 3 strategies that include enhanced access to monitor and providing appropriate collaborative support to students and seeking new technology for faculty and staff to monitor and provide appropriate student support services; increasing success and completion of male students of color and participate in the Texas Education Consortium for Male Students of Color; increasing retention of students identified as "atrisk" and the development of proactive student self-assessment (at-risk issues); improving course availability to ensure students' academic progress and conduct student satisfaction surveys and focus groups; increasing number of Reverse Transfer graduates and using National Clearing House reports to process more reverse transfer graduates.

Dr. Wilson concluded the presentation by stating the Operational Strategic Plan and the SEM plan are living documents and allow us to be responsive to ever-changing conditions.

Version three of the Operational Plan will be released early next year. The current Strategic Plan is in effect through August 2024. There will be two more workshops this year for Goals 3 and 4 in the Spring and for Goals 5 and 6 in the Summer. The dedicated team of professionals will support the College's goals and provide success.

Dr. Wilson, Ms. Benavides-Dominguez, Ms. Sanders, Ms. Williams, and Dr. Escamilla responded to questions from the Board of Regents.

At 11:36 a.m., the Chair announced that the Board was going into Closed Session pursuant to:

The Board reconvened in Open Session at 12:59 p.m. with no action taken.

SUBJECT: Recommendation for Professor Emeritus Status for Mr. Ken Rosier

In accordance with Board Policy 5.33 and its subsections, the Faculty Council received a request for consideration of Professor Emeritus status for Mr. Kenneth V. Rosier. During the meeting on December 3, 2021, the Faculty Council members reviewed the supporting documentation that included Mr. Rosier's eligibility for this designation, the nomination by the Department Chair, and endorsement by the Dean. The Council supported the nomination and voted unanimously in favor of the motion. The nomination packet was forwarded to me for review.

Mr. Rosier provided over 32 years of service to the College as a faculty member of the Art Program and later as the chairperson over the Department of Art and Drama. During his tenure at the College, he demonstrated distinguished leadership and notable dedication to our students, the College, the community, and the field of Art. Therefore, I highly recommend conferral of the Professor Emeritus status for Mr. Kenneth V. Rosier. Thank you for your review and consideration of presenting this prestigious honor for Mr. Rosier to the Board of Regents as per policy for granting authority by means of appropriate resolution.

Supporting Documentation for the Professor Emeritus Recommendation

- **B5.33 Emeritus Status:** Full-time members of the faculty and administration may be considered for emeritus status according to the following guidelines.
  - **B5.33.1 Purpose:** This policy is designed to provide a method of special recognition to faculty and administrators for outstanding service, significant contribution to higher education, meritorious teaching, and/or special honors bestowed by a renowned organization.
  - **B5.33.2 Eligibility:** To be eligible for consideration of emeritus status, a member of the faculty or administration must meet or exceed the following:
    - **B5.33.2.1** Retire from Del Mar College with retirement to be as defined in the Texas State College and University Employee Uniform Benefits Program, created by the provision of Senate Bill 95, Acts of the 65th Legislature Regular Session, 1977.
    - B5.33.2.2 Hold faculty or administrative rank, or both, at the time of retirement.
    - B5.33.2.3 Have served the College as a full-time member of the faculty and/or administration for at least ten years, demonstrating distinction in the performance of all fundamental responsibilities of faculty (B6.3 and B6.4) or their equivalent for administrative programs.
    - B5.33.2.4 The Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the College shall decide on questioned eligibility in cases not covered by the guidelines.
  - B5.33.3 Emeritus Titles: Emeritus title to be conferred shall be as follows:
    - **B5.33.3.1 Administration:** The title of the position held by the eligible administrator shall determine the emeritus title.
    - B5.33.3.2 Faculty: The title of an eligible faculty member shall be the title of the rank held at the time of retirement, for example, Professor Emeritus. A faculty member also holding an administrative title (such as Department Chair) may be honored by the use of the administrative title as well as Professor Emeritus.
  - **A5.33.4 Procedures and Guidelines for Emeritus Status Award:** Consideration for approval of emeritus status shall originate with the next higher authority above the retiree. The following guidelines will apply:

#### A5.33.4.1 Faculty Members:

**A5.33.4.1.1 Procedure:** Consideration for emeritus status shall originate with nomination by the next higher administrative authority above the candidate, or by at least three colleagues within the candidate's Division. The following guidelines shall apply:

A5.33.4.1.1.1 It shall be the responsibility of the Chief Academic Officer (CAO) to monitor nominations for emeritus status of faculty, to apply the guidelines for eligibility, and to oversee the review and approval process for emeritus awards.

**A5.33.4.1.1.2** Within one year after an eligible faculty member's retirement, the immediate supervisor or three colleagues within the same Division shall propose the candidate's nomination to the Dean of the Division (or next higher authority), and document the candidate's eligibility to receive the award.

**A5.33.4.1.1.3** The Dean (or next higher authority) shall review the nomination and send it, with the proper documentation supporting the candidate's eligibility, to the Faculty Council, indicating to recommend or not to recommend. The Council shall, in turn, weigh the merits of each candidate, apply the eligibility guidelines, and by majority vote recommend or not recommend a candidate for emeritus status.

**A5.33.4.1.1.4** The Council's recommendation, along with the Dean's recommendation, and all documentation, shall be sent to the CAO for review. The CAO shall review the information and send it with his or her recommendation to the CEO.

**A5.33.4.1.1.5** The CEO shall review the forwarded documentation and make the final recommendation to the Board of Regents to confer emeritus status to the candidate. The Board of Regents shall be the granting authority by means of appropriate resolution.

**A5.33.4.1.2 Guidelines**: Guidelines used to evaluate a faculty member's eligibility for the award of emeritus status must include documentation of distinction shown in the performance of all fundamental responsibilities of faculty over the span of the faculty member's career. Such performance could include, but is not limited to, the following:

A5.33.4.1.2.1 Distinction in professional practice includes exhibiting outstanding teaching, librarianship, or counseling performance and assessment of student learning; serving as a mentor to colleagues; developing new instructional techniques, courses, forms of educational delivery, or relevant services; demonstrating recognized leadership in the professional area through awards given by the College and/or professional organizations; publications, scholarship, or comparable achievements; or providing outstanding service to students through tutoring, mentoring, advising, and sponsoring student organizations.

**A5.33.4.1.2.2** Distinction in educational growth includes a record of continuous self-improvement and development via formal coursework, scholarship or comparable achievements, or other professional development opportunities.

A5.33.4.1.2.3 Distinction in institutional and community service is demonstrated by substantial accomplishments in academic advising, marketing, and recruiting for the faculty's program area; significant program, department, and College committee work, including leadership roles; and/or work with and recognition by community organizations for contributions by the emeritus candidate which improve the community and promote the College mission.

#### A5.33.4.2 Administrators

**A5.33.4.2.1 Procedures and Guidelines:** Consideration for approval of emeritus status shall originate with the next higher authority above the candidate. The following guidelines will apply:

A5.33.4.2.1.1 It shall be the responsibility of the appropriate Vice President to monitor requests for emeritus status of administrators and faculty and request the CAO to convene the Instructional and Student Development Council in order to apply the guidelines for eligibility. Recommendations and/or comments from the candidate's Chair or supervisor shall be addressed to the Council.

**A5.33.4.2.1.2** The Council shall weigh the merits of each candidate, apply the eligibility criteria, and by majority vote recommend or not recommend each candidate for emeritus status. If the majority vote is to not recommend or if the candidate does not meet the eligibility criteria, no further action will be taken.

A5.33.4.2.1.3 If the majority vote is to recommend and the candidate is eligible, the Council shall recommend conferring of emeritus status through the appropriate Vice President. The channel of recommendations shall be from the Council to the appropriate Vice President, from the Vice President to the CEO, and from the CEO to the Board of Regents. The Board of Regents shall be the granting authority by means of appropriate resolution.

**A5.33.5 Perquisites:** Perquisites accruing to the candidate awarded emeritus status by the Board of Regents shall include the following:

A5.33.5.1 Listing in the emeritus section of the College Catalog.

- **A5.33.5.2** Listing in the Del Mar College Faculty-Staff <u>Directory</u>, if requested by the emeritus awardee.
- **A5.33.5.3** Inclusion of the emeritus awardee's name on College mailing lists for publications and notices of interest.
- **A5.33.5.4** A framed copy of the Board of Regents' resolution conferring emeritus status.
- **A5.33.5.5** A permanent identification card which shall identify the designated emeritus status.
- **A5.33.5.6** When available and if the emeritus awardee continues to work for the College after retirement, office space, full e-mail access, and a reserved parking space.
- **A5.33.5.7** Invitations for the emeritus awardee to participate in College commencement ceremonies and other relevant recognition activities.

#### **Emeritus Committee:**

It is with great honor that I recommend Professor Ken Rosier for consideration for Professor Emeritus status. Professor Rosier was not only an exemplary teacher, mentor and professional artist, but he contributed immeasurably to Del Mar College through his artistic/scholarly work, his service to the college, Art department, and community, and through his dedication to the field of Art.

Professor Rosier earned his Bachelor of Fine Arts in Ceramics and Drawing (BFA) from Wichita State University in 1977 and Master of Fine Arts in Ceramics and Sculpture (MFA) from University of North Texas in 1980. He began his college teaching career at Bee County College teaching Ceramics, Sculpture, Drawing and serving as Gallery Director from 1982-1988. He joined the Del Mar College Art Department in 1988 as an Assistant Professor in Ceramics where he helped design and equip the new ceramics studio for the soon to be completed Fine Arts Center. Professor Rosier's ceramics class was consistently one of the most sought-after sections in the arts core and during his open lab hours you were sure to find a hive of students learning the craft. His student evaluations were always positive and comments always reflected him as an excellent teacher who conducted an exceptional class.

As a popular teacher Ken was able to mentor and advise hundreds of student artists, many of whom are still academically or professionally involved in their craft today. Early in his tenure with the college Ken, as faculty sponsor of the Student Art Association, was instrumental in establishing the popular Be-Bop Bowl fundraiser. Over several decades the event raised thousands of dollars that benefited the art students with travel opportunities and scholarship awards. Ken also established the Student Art Show allowing students to showcase their art for the benefit of the college community. Professor Rosier always put the students first and foremost in his work for the college.

Professor Rosier continued to improve his teaching and leadership skills through workshops offered at Texas Association of Schools of Art (TASA) and the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD) annual conferences. Ken's leadership guided the Art Program through two successful self-studies involving the National Association of Schools of Art and Design (NASAD) accreditation process. He helped craft the extensive documents and chaired the arduous, multi-year process which resulted in the awarding of positive status for the Del Mar Art Program in 2006 and 2016.

As a testament to Ken as a teacher, colleague, and artist, I wanted to share a story. For several years the Del Mar College Art Program had been in discussion with Joseph Cain's family to host a retrospective of Joe's work. Joseph Cain was a titan in the Corpus Christi art community and chairperson of the department of art from 1969-1980. The Fine Art Gallery on the Heritage Campus is named in his honor. The exhibition was planned for the fall of 2020 and as you know the college was in a virtual lockdown with Covid-19 protocols, but Ken felt it was imperative that the art program host the show to honor the commitment to the Cain family and to the memory of Joe himself.

He took it upon himself in securing, gathering, curating, installing and lighting 106 pieces of Joe Cain's artwork in a spectacular salon style exhibition. Unfortunately, few patrons were able to view the work in the gallery because of the protocols but I encourage you to search for the Joseph Cain Gallery on the Del Mar College website to view the video of the exhibit.

It is evident that Professor Rosier meets and exceeds the guidelines as set forth by the policy for Emeritus Status, Again, Ken Rosier has my highest recommendation for your consideration to receive Professor Emeritus status at Del Mar College.

#### **New Year – Same Problems**

Nineteen months into the pandemic has not stopped the US economy. It is exhibiting clear signs of improvement although risks remain including new strains of the virus.

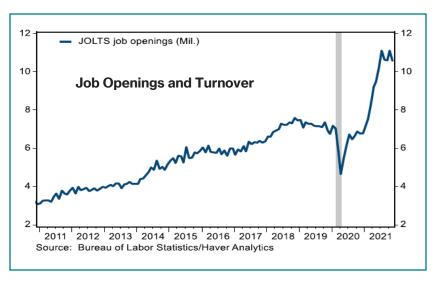
At the start of 2021 growth was robust as businesses re-opened. But by 3Q growth had once again slowed as trillions in support programs were withdrawn and supply chains remained kinked. But the newly revised 3Q GDP shows an economy growing at a 2.3% level and each revision has been revised higher indicating solid growth.

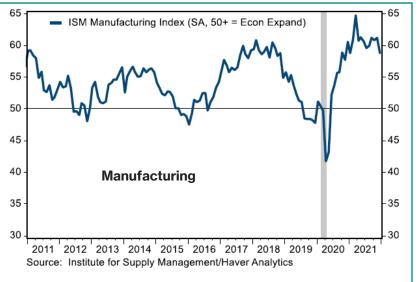
Jobs remain a quandary. Employers have posted 10.6M openings in November and while that is huge in itself, this marks the six straight month job vacancies have topped 10M. Surveys show workers are quitting do to health concerns, more competitive salaries, a better work-life balance or childcare needs with schools remaining virtual.

Supply chains have started to unwind and with that US manufacturing strength continues to climb back.

The consumer also did not disappoint in her Christmas shopping splurge the sales showed a year-over-year increase of 13.7%. Some of this is due likely on an overall personal income increase of 7.4% year-over-year.

Congress is promoting more stimulus and a new \$68B bill has been introduced for covid relief for small business. Knowing that those businesses received \$5.7T over the past 22 months, and with GDP firmly in the black one has to question the reason for more support. Is it motivated for business or the mid-term elections?







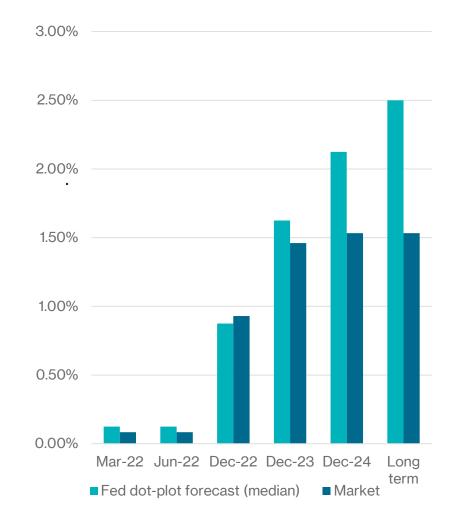
#### Global Recovery at the Mercy of Covid

The Federal Reserve is clearly been challenged to control inflation and as the December FOMC minutes clearly indicated they will due so by pulling back on the very generous accommodation presented during the pandemic.

There is no pre-set agenda or calendar for their actions and they will remain strongly data dependent but the minutes are clear. The FOMC indicates that inflation needs to be cooled and they have a comfort level with raising Fed Funds sooner and quicker rather than later. The *dot plot* shows some Governors anticipating up to 4 rate hikes in 2022 but 5 indicate two hikes. Somewhere in between lies the future. Much will depend on the pace at which inflation cools.

The monetary punch bowl is also being taken away. An unusual aggressive approach to reducing the Fed's balance sheet is under serious discussion. The balance sheet has ballooned from \$4.2T before the pandemic to \$8.7T by December 2021. The December minutes stated that "Some participants noted that it could be appropriate to begin to reduce the size of the Federal Reserve's balance sheet relatively soon after beginning to raise the federal funds rate."

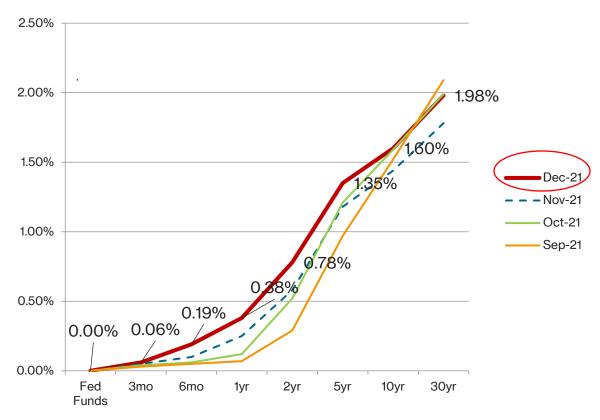
This combination of these challenges might indicate that the Fed will use the balance sheet in combination with the Fed Funds rate in the future.





## The Fed's Planned Taper has Its Uplifting Effect

- The curve has jumped up markedly reacting to the taper plans and possible rate hikes from the Fed to begin in January.
- The curve may continue to show a move higher as the Fed starts its move and inflation remains high.
- The recognition that inflation is not temporary has the market moving on fears that it must be halted.
- Investors are anticipating a much earlier move by the Fed on overnight rates. Perhaps even early second quarter.

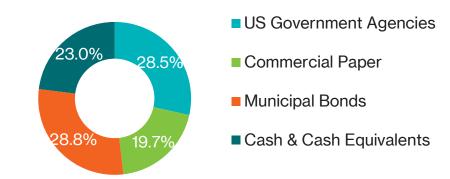

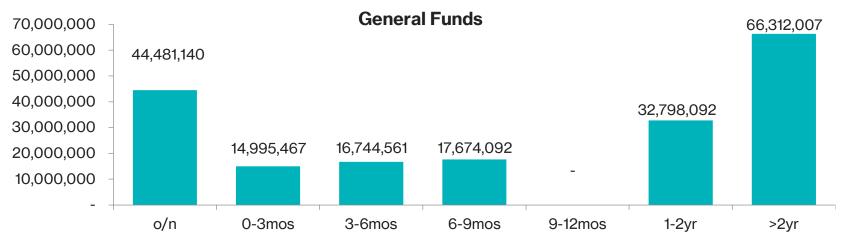

#### **Your Maturity Distribution**

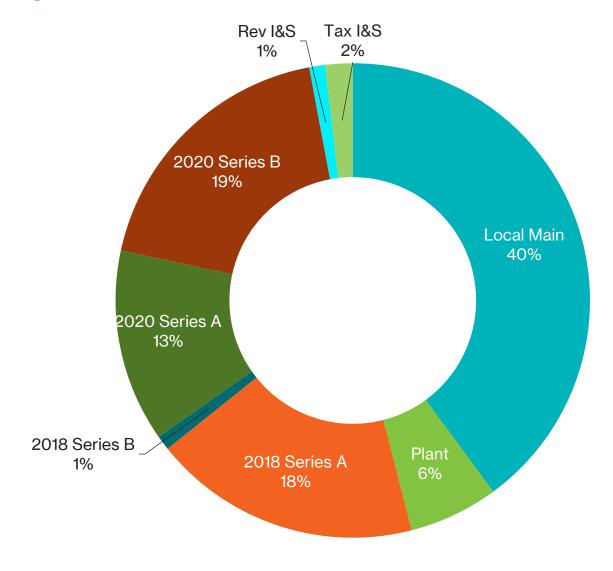

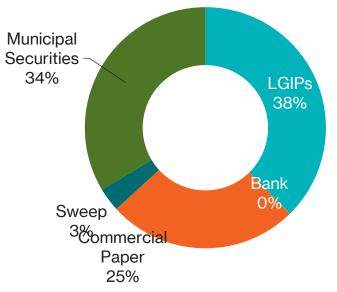

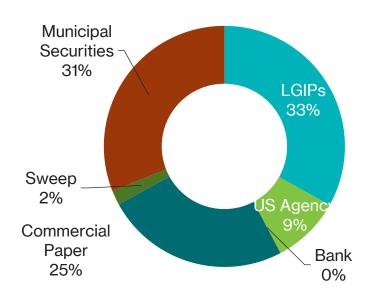
#### Asset allocation of Pooled Funds

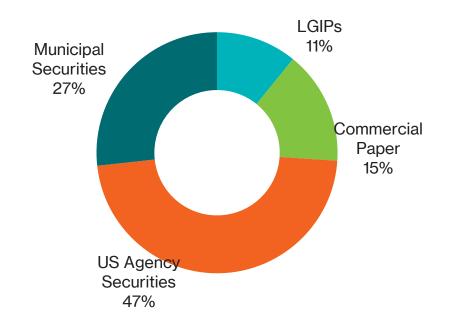

## Santa Goes on a Budget



Inflation continues and is growing at elevated levels. It appears increases are here to stay for the foreseeable future, prompting consumers and businesses to adjust their spending patterns and business strategies accordingly. Across the spectrum prices are rising from building supplies to food and it ripples throughout the economy.

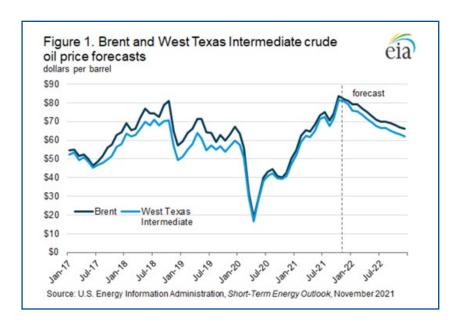
The economy is strong as evidenced by a firm GDP reading but the supply chains continue to rattle. Manufacturing globally is slowed, ships are stalled at ports, and once here we lack the trains and truckers to deliver the goods.

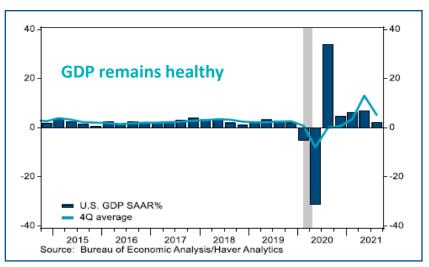
Oil has fallen from the \$80 barrel back to \$65 on release of the strategic oil reserves but 50M gallons may not last long.

The supply problems have started to impact the housing boom as wood and other commodities are difficult to obtain. Existing home sales have fallen to the weakest in 8 months, but demand is still there as housing permits continue to grow – if supplies can be found.

Manufacturing is struggling and some industries like autos are still stymied by chip supply. Estimates of when this chain will loosen range from six months to two years. And, now with a new covid variant, Omicron, staffing could once again be impacted. Truckers alone have indicated 37% would quit if blanket vaccination requirements were implemented.

With wages rising and personal income increasing, the American consumer continues to spend. While consumers are spending, with inflation they are spending more and getting less. Maybe Santa will have to go on a budget in 2021.





# **Retiring the Word "Transitory"**



The Federal Reserve has played a major role in the pandemic and the markets are watching closely if and when the Fed's position on support for a now strong economy will change.

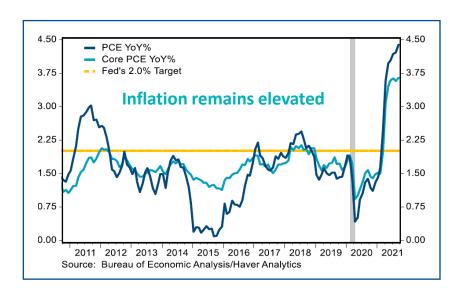
One uncertainty has been muted as Jerome Powell has been nominated for a second 6-year term as Chair. The nomination must now pass the Senate. Regardless if he or Brainard would have been named we could expect accommodation to continue. The question is how much.

The FOMC noted in their November meeting that they plan to discuss moving to a taper (less accommodative buying) in 2022, but recent comments by Powell indicate that might start in December and move faster than the previously announced schedule. Rate hikes are another matter and may or may not follow tapering. However, the Fed can hike overnight rates three times (to 0.75%) without leaving the historic definition of an accommodative stance.

The Fed is clearly recognizing that the inflation situation is no longer "transitory" but they will continue to support their mandate for strong economy and employment.

One factor that will play into the uncertainty in December is the debt ceiling. The can that was kicked down the road last quarter spins to a stop December 15th.

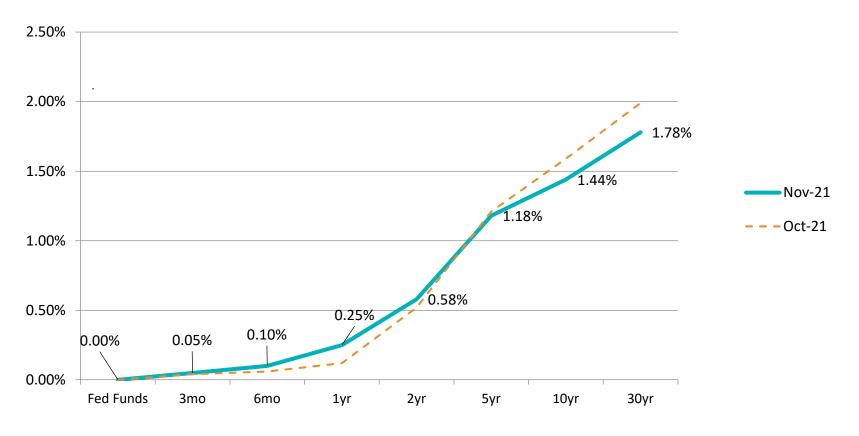
The debt ceiling vote does complicate the required \$118B payment due the Highway Trust Fund due in one month as well as other stimulus bills.



### **Movement in the Curve**



- Bond yields had been on the move to higher rates but a new strain of Covid (Omicron) has brought risk back to the markets.
- The belly of the curve continues to show a move higher, but the long end shows investors still favor the safety of Treasuries.
- Investors feel that inflation will likely bring Fed actions in mid-2022.
- The Fed is hinting strongly on a taper to begin in early 2022.
- The steepness in the yield curve presents buying opportunities for securities in 3-5 year maturities.

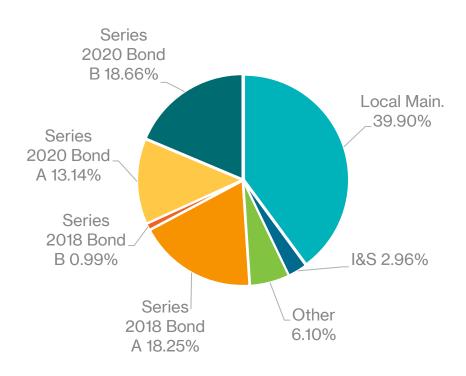

Liquidity has been reduced to little or no value but with a flat short curve it may be the only sector available out to twelve months without the use of CP. Our expectation is of continuing dismally low rates, but we look for value in your authorized sectors to capture the yield available as markets change.
- The non-cash portion of your portfolio is yielding 0.43%.

**B3.21 Tuition Policy:** The per semester credit hour tuition rate for credit courses shall increase by a minimum of \$1.00 each fall semester for Texas in-district residents, Texas out-of-district residents, out-of-state residents, and foreign students. Any student whose legal residence is outside the Del Mar College District shall be charged an out-of-district fee. All student tuition and fees shall be set by the Board of Regents.

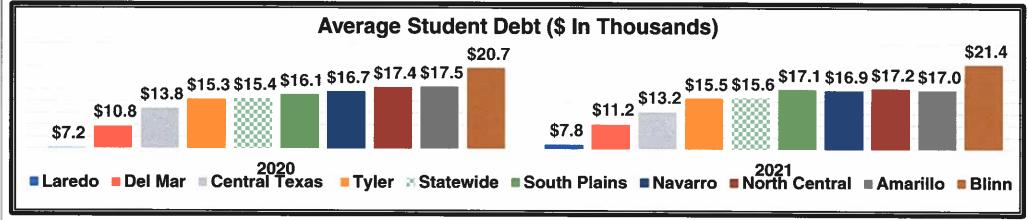

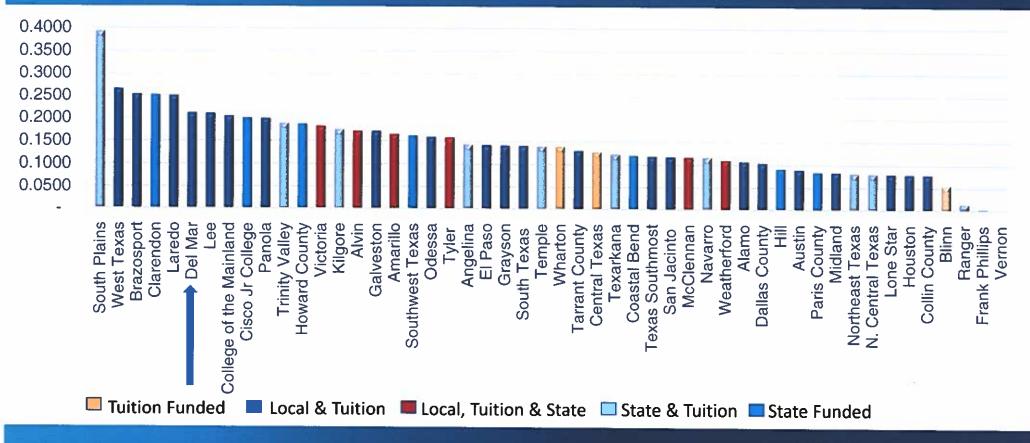
